**A** RAGING FIRE BLEW THE TOP OFF HILDA AND RAY JONES'S 1900 Queen Anne in Pensacola, Florida. But the really bad news came with the steep bids for rebuilding the complex, five-gabled roof. The couple had just about given up on the project when local architect George Demmy proposed a money-saving solution: constructing the roof out of engineered trusses on the ground and then lifting it into place with a crane.

Even with the rental cost for the crane, the couple saved a ton of money. Work went much faster on the ground, cutting labor costs substantially. The lift was a two-day operation, one for setup and another for the hoist—which earned a rousing cheer from the 400 or so spectators on hand.
